Committee on Appropriations.

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

SB19-228 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

1 Amend reengrossed bill, page 6, strike lines 14 through 26.

2 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

3 Page 9, strike lines 13 through 27.

4 Strike pages 10 and 11.

5 Page 12, strike lines 1 through 14 and substitute:

6 "SECTION 7. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-80-106, **add** (3)
7 as follows:

8 **27-80-106. Purchase of prevention and treatment services.**

9 (3) (a) THERE IS CREATED IN THE OFFICE OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH,
10 REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "OFFICE", THE CHARLIE HUGHES
11 AND NATHAN GAUNA OPIOID PREVENTION GRANT PROGRAM TO IMPROVE
12 YOUNG LIVES, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "PROGRAM", FOR
13 PREVENTING OPIOID USE AMONG THE STATE'S YOUTH POPULATION.

14 (b) THE OFFICE SHALL, IN COORDINATION WITH THE STATE PLAN
15 FORMULATED PURSUANT TO SECTION 27-80-102, PURCHASE PREVENTION
16 SERVICES FROM ONE OR MORE COMMUNITY-BASED YOUTH DEVELOPMENT
17 ORGANIZATIONS THAT ADMINISTER EVIDENCE-BASED SUBSTANCE USE
18 PREVENTION PROGRAMS TO YOUTH AND FAMILIES. THE OFFICE SHALL
19 PRIORITIZE THE AMOUNTS OF FUNDING REQUESTED IN THEIR ENTIRETY OR

1 IN AMOUNTS SUFFICIENT TO ENSURE THAT GRANT RECIPIENTS ARE ABLE TO
2 FULLY OR SUBSTANTIALLY IMPLEMENT PROGRAMS TO FIDELITY. THE
3 OFFICE MAY USE UP TO TEN PERCENT OF THE MONEY APPROPRIATED TO
4 THE PROGRAM FOR ADMINISTRATION AND EVALUATION OF THE PROGRAM.

5 (c) THIS SUBSECTION (3) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 1,
6 2020."

7 Page 13, line 6, strike "FOUR" and substitute "THREE".

8 Page 13, line 14, strike "GENERAL FUND" and substitute "MARIJUANA TAX
9 CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 39-28.8-501 (1)".

10 Page 13, line 20, strike "and (25)(a)(XXI)".

11 Page 13, strike lines 26 and 27.

12 Page 14, strike line 1.

13 Page 14, line 3, strike "(XXI)" and substitute "(XX)".

14 Page 14, after line 7 insert:

15 "SECTION 10. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 27-80-119 as
16 follows:

17 **27-80-119. Perinatal substance use data linkage project -**
18 **center for research into substance use disorder prevention,**
19 **treatment, and recovery support strategies - report.** (1) THE CENTER
20 FOR RESEARCH INTO SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER PREVENTION, TREATMENT,
21 AND RECOVERY SUPPORT STRATEGIES ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 27-80-118,
22 REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "CENTER", IN PARTNERSHIP WITH AN
23 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND THE STATE SUBSTANCE ABUSE
24 TREND AND RESPONSE TASK FORCE ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 18-18.5-103,
25 MAY CONDUCT A STATEWIDE PERINATAL SUBSTANCE USE DATA LINKAGE
26 PROJECT THAT USES ONGOING COLLECTION, ANALYSIS, INTERPRETATION,
27 AND DISSEMINATION OF DATA FOR THE PLANNING, IMPLEMENTATION, AND
28 EVALUATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH ACTIONS TO IMPROVE OUTCOMES FOR
29 FAMILIES IMPACTED BY SUBSTANCE USE DURING PREGNANCY. THE DATA
30 LINKAGE PROJECT MAY CONSIDER STATE-ADMINISTERED DATA SOURCES
31 THAT INCLUDE:

32 (a) HEALTH CARE UTILIZATION BY PREGNANT AND POSTPARTUM
33 WOMEN WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS AND THEIR INFANTS;

1 (b) HUMAN SERVICE AND PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM UTILIZATION
2 BY PREGNANT AND POSTPARTUM WOMEN WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS
3 AND THEIR INFANTS;

4 (c) HEALTH CARE, HUMAN SERVICE, AND PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM
5 OUTCOMES AMONG PREGNANT AND POSTPARTUM WOMEN WITH
6 SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS AND THEIR INFANTS; AND

7 (d) COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH HEALTH CARE, HUMAN SERVICE, AND
8 PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAM PROVISION FOR PREGNANT AND POSTPARTUM
9 WOMEN WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS AND THEIR INFANTS.

10 (2) THE DATA LINKAGE PROJECT SHALL USE VITAL RECORDS TO
11 ESTABLISH MATERNAL AND INFANT DYADS BEGINNING AT THE BIRTH
12 HOSPITALIZATION AND RETROSPECTIVELY LINK THE PRENATAL PERIOD
13 AND PROSPECTIVELY LINK THE FIRST YEAR POSTPARTUM.

14 (3) THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY WILL
15 OBTAIN DATA AND PERFORM SECURE LINKAGE AND ANONYMIZATION ON
16 BEHALF OF THE STATE.

17 (4) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2021, THE CENTER SHALL REPORT
18 PROGRESS ON THE DATA LINKAGE PROJECT AND THE RESULTS, IF
19 AVAILABLE, TO THE HEALTH AND INSURANCE COMMITTEE AND THE PUBLIC
20 HEALTH CARE AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF
21 REPRESENTATIVES AND THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE
22 OF THE SENATE OR THEIR SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES."

23 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

24 Page 14, lines 20 and 21, strike "PROVIDE GENERAL FUND MONEY TO".

25 Page 15, line 16, strike "THREE" and substitute "TWO".

26 Page 15, line 19, strike "SIX" and substitute "FOUR".

27 Page 17, line 15, strike "GENERAL FUND" and substitute "MARIJUANA TAX
28 CASH FUND CREATED IN SECTION 39-28.8-501 (1)".

32 **"SECTION 15. Appropriation.** (1) For the 2019-20 state fiscal
33 year, \$1,192,367 is appropriated to the department of human services for

1 use by the office of behavioral health. This appropriation is from the
2 marijuana tax cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To
3 implement this act, the office may use this appropriation as follows:

4 (a) \$692,367 for the maternal and child health pilot program,
5 which amount is based on an assumption that the office will require an
6 additional 1.6 FTE; and

7 (b) \$500,000 for the Charlie Hughes and Nathan Guana opioid
8 prevention grant program to improve young lives, which amount is based
9 on an assumption that the office will require an additional 0.5 FTE.

10 (2) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$1,100,000 is appropriated
11 to the department of higher education for use by the regents of the
12 university of Colorado. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash
13 fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
14 regents may use this appropriation for allocation to the center for research
15 into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support
16 strategies.

17 (3) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$2,000,000 is appropriated
18 to the department of public health and environment. This appropriation
19 is from the marijuana tax cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1),
20 C.R.S. To implement this act, the office may use this appropriation as
21 follows:

22 (a) \$71,852 for use by the prevention services division for
23 administration, which amount is based on an assumption that the division
24 will require an additional 0.9 FTE;

25 (b) \$1,564,148 for distributions to local public health agencies;
26 and

27 (c) \$364,000 for personal services related to health statistics and
28 vital records."
