22 **"SECTION 24. Appropriation.** (1) For the 2019-20 state fiscal

1 year, \$157,754 is appropriated to the department of human services for  
2 use by the office of behavioral health. This appropriation is from the  
3 general fund and is based on an assumption that the office will require an  
4 additional 1.5 FTE. To implement this act, the office may use this  
5 appropriation for the administration and evaluation expenses related to  
6 the Charlie Hughes and Nathan Gauna opioid prevention grant program.

7 (2) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$2,000,000 is appropriated  
8 to the youth opioid and substance use prevention fund created in section  
9 27-80-103.5 (4), C.R.S. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash  
10 fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. The department of human  
11 services is responsible for the accounting related to this appropriation.

12 (3) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$997,754 is appropriated to  
13 the department of human services for use by the office of behavioral  
14 health. This appropriation is from the general fund and is based on an  
15 assumption that the office will require an additional 1.5 FTE. To  
16 implement this act, the office may use this appropriation for the maternal  
17 and child health pilot program.

18 (4) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$750,000 is appropriated to  
19 the department of higher education for use by the regents of the university  
20 of Colorado. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash fund  
21 created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the  
22 regents may use this appropriation for allocation to the center for research  
23 into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support  
24 strategies and the college of nursing.

25 (5) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$50,000 is appropriated to  
26 the department of higher education. This appropriation is from the general  
27 fund. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation  
28 for the college opportunity fund program to be used for limited purpose  
29 fee-for-service contracts with state institutions.

30 (6) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$50,000 is appropriated to  
31 the department of higher education. This appropriation is from  
32 reappropriated funds received from the limited purpose fee-for-service  
33 contracts with state institutions under subsection (6) of this section. To  
34 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the  
35 regents of the university of Colorado for allocation to the center for  
36 research into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery  
37 support strategies.

38 (7) For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$2,000,000 is appropriated  
39 to the department of public health and environment. This appropriation  
40 is from the general fund. To implement this act, the office may use this  
41 appropriation as follows:

1           (a) \$71,852 for use by the prevention services division for  
2 administration, which amount is based on an assumption that the division  
3 will require an additional 0.9 FTE;  
4           (b) \$1,564,148 for distributions to local public health agencies;  
5 and  
6           (c) \$364,000 for personal services related to health statistics and  
7 vital records."
