HOUSE BILL 21-1196

CONCERNING THE UPDATING OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE CLAUSE OF SENATE BILL 19-263, AS AMENDED BY SENATE BILL 20-152, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ENSURING THAT THE BILL ACCOMPLISHES ITS INTENDED LEGAL EFFECT OF ELIMINATING THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE STATE TREASURER EXECUTE LEASE-PURCHASE AGREEMENTS TO FUND TRANSPORTATION PROJECTS DURING THE 2021-22 STATE FISCAL YEAR IF A REFERRED BALLOT ISSUE THAT AUTHORIZES THE STATE TO ISSUE TRANSPORTATION REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES IS APPROVED AT THE NOVEMBER 2021 STATEWIDE ELECTION.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. In Session Laws of Colorado 2019, section 8 of chapter 334, **amend** (2), as (2) is amended by section 1 of chapter 36, (SB 20-152), Session Laws of Colorado 2020, as follows:

Section 8. **Effective date.** (2) Section 24-82-1303 (2)(a)(I), (2)(a)(II), (2)(a)(III), (2)(a)(IV), (2)(b), and (2)(d)(II), Colorado Revised

Capital letters or bold & italic numbers indicate new material added to existing law; dashes through words or numbers indicate deletions from existing law and such material is not part of the act.

Statutes, as amended in section 4 of this act, takes effect only if a majority of the electors voting on the ballot issue that authorizes the state to issue transportation revenue anticipation notes and that is submitted to the registered electors of the state for their approval or rejection at the November ~~2020~~ general 2021 STATEWIDE election pursuant to section 43-4-705 (13)(b)(III), Colorado Revised Statutes, vote "Yes/For", and, in such case, section 24-82-1303 (2)(a)(I), (2)(a)(II), (2)(a)(III), (2)(a)(IV), (2)(b), and (2)(d)(II), Colorado Revised Statutes, as amended in section 4 of this act, takes effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,


determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
