Committee on Appropriations.

After consideration on the merits, the Committee recommends the following:

SB21-137 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation:

1 Amend the Health & Human Services Committee Report, dated April 5,
2 2021, page 1, strike lines 1 and 2 and substitute:

3 "Amend printed bill, page 4, line 7, strike "2020-21 THROUGH 2022-23"
4 and substitute "2021-22 THROUGH 2023-24".

5 Page 1 of the committee report, after line 3 insert:

6 "Page 4, line 21, strike "2022-23" and substitute "2023-24".

7 Page 4, line 25, strike "2023." and substitute "2024.".

8 Amend printed bill, page 4, after line 3 insert:

9 "SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-1-104, **amend**
10 (1)(b)(II); and **amend as it will become effective July 1, 2021**, (1)(c) as
11 follows:

12 **23-1-104. Financing the system of postsecondary education -**
13 **report.** (1) (b) (II) For the 2010-11 fiscal year and for fiscal years
14 beginning on or after July 1, 2016, the general assembly shall also make
15 annual appropriations of cash funds, other than cash funds received as
16 tuition income or as fees, as a single line item to each governing board for
17 the operation of its campuses. Each governing board shall allocate said

1 cash fund appropriations to the institutions under its control in the manner
2 deemed most appropriate by the governing board; except that, if the
3 general assembly appropriates money pursuant to section 23-31.5-112 OR
4 27-80-118, that money is not included within the single line item
5 appropriation described in this subsection (1)(b)(II).

6 (c) ***[Editor's note: This version of subsection (1)(c) introductory***
7 ***portion is effective July 1, 2021.]*** In addition to any appropriations made
8 pursuant to subsection (1)(a) or (1)(b) of this section, the general
9 assembly may make annual appropriations of general fund money and of
10 money received pursuant to a fee-for-service contract negotiated by the
11 board of governors of the Colorado state university system and the
12 department of higher education, as described in section 23-18-303 or
13 23-18-303.5, whichever is applicable, as separate line items to:

14 (I) The Colorado state forest service described in part 3 of article
15 31 of this ~~title~~ TITLE 23;

16 (II) The agricultural experiment station department of the
17 Colorado state university described in part 6 of article 31 of this ~~title~~; and
18 TITLE 23;

19 (III) The Colorado state university cooperative extension service
20 described in part 7 of article 31 of this ~~title~~ TITLE 23; AND

21 (IV) THE CENTER FOR RESEARCH INTO SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER
22 PREVENTION, TREATMENT, AND RECOVERY SUPPORT STRATEGIES CREATED
23 IN SECTION 27-80-118."

24 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

25 Page 6 of the printed bill, strike lines 5 through 22.

26 Renumber succeeding sections accordingly.

27 Page 21 of the printed bill, strike line 22 and substitute "program."

28 Page 21 of the printed bill, strike line 27 and substitute "program."

29 Strike page 22 of the printed bill.

30 Strike page 23 of the printed bill.

31 Page 24 of the printed bill, strike line 1.

32 Page 24 of the printed bill, before line 2 insert:

33 "(3) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$5,850,000 is



1 appropriated to the department of human services for use by the office of
2 behavioral health. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
3 implement this act, the office may use this appropriation as follows:

4 (a) \$4,000,000 for the housing assistance program, which amount
5 is based on an assumption that the office will require an additional 1.0
6 FTE;

7 (b) \$1,600,000 for the recovery support services grant program,
8 which amount is based on an assumption that the office will require an
9 additional 1.0 FTE;

10 (c) \$50,000 for rural behavioral health vouchers; and

11 (d) \$200,000 for treatment and detoxification programs for
12 recovery residence certification;

13 (4) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$1,900,000 is appropriated
14 to the department of public health and environment. This appropriation
15 is from the general fund. To implement this act, the department may use
16 this appropriation as follows:

17 (a) \$500,000 for sexually transmitted infections, HIV and AIDS
18 operating expenses;

19 (b) \$575,000 for school-based health centers;

20 (c) \$250,000 for mental health first aid training; and

21 (d) \$575,000 for opiate antagonist bulk purchase.

22 (5) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$690,000 is appropriated to
23 the department of human services for use by the office of early childhood.
24 This appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the
25 office may use this appropriation for early childhood mental health
26 services.

27 (6) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$120,000 is appropriated to
28 the department of law. This appropriation is from the general fund. To
29 implement this act, the department may use this appropriation for the
30 office of community engagement.

31 (7) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$4,350,000 is appropriated to
32 the department of higher education. This appropriation consists of
33 \$600,000 from the general fund and \$3,750,000 from the marijuana tax
34 cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this
35 act, the department may use this appropriation for the center for research
36 into substance use disorder prevention, treatment, and recovery support
37 strategies at the university of Colorado health sciences center.

38 (8) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$900,000 is appropriated to the
39 department of higher education. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax
40 cash fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
41 department may use this appropriation for allocation to the Colorado state
42 university cooperative extension service agrability project.



1 (9) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, \$112,179 is appropriated to the
2 department of health care policy and financing. This appropriation is from the
3 general fund. To implement this act, the department may use this appropriation
4 as follows:
5 (a) \$33,960 for use by the executive director's office for personal
6 services; and
7 (b) \$78,219 for medical services premiums, which amount is subject to
8 the "(M)" notation as defined in the annual general appropriations act for the
9 same fiscal year.
10 (10) For the 2021-22 state fiscal year, the general assembly anticipates
11 that the department of health care policy and financing will receive \$112,179
12 in federal funds to implement this act. The appropriation in subsection (9) of
13 this section is based on the assumption that the department will receive this
14 amount of federal funds to be used as follows:
15 (a) \$33,960 for use by the executive director's office for personal
16 services and which is subject to the "(I)" notation as defined in the annual
17 general appropriation act for the same fiscal year; and
18 (b) \$78,219 for medical services premiums."

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
