| HB22-1297 be amended as follows, and as so amended, be referred to the Committee of the Whole with favorable recommendation: |
| Amend printed bill, page 4, strike lines 19 through 24 and substitute: |
| "(b) (I) This subsection (2.5) takes effect at two o'clock antemeridian on the first Sunday of November after the governor notifies the revisor of statutes that the following conditions have occurred: (A) A federal law is enacted and takes effect that authorizes states to adopt coordinated universal time minus six hours, commonly known as "United States Mountain Daylight" |
| SAVING TIME", AS THE STANDARD TIME FOR THE STATE THROUGHOUT THE YEAR; AND |
| (B) AT LEAST FOUR STATES IN THE MOUNTAIN STANDARD TIME ZONE, IN ADDITION TO COLORADO, ENACT LEGISLATION THAT BECOMES LAW MAKING COORDINATED UNIVERSAL TIME MINUS SIX HOURS, COMMONLY KNOWN AS "UNITED STATES MOUNTAIN DAYLIGHT SAVING TIME", THE STATES' STANDARD TIME THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. (II) THE GOVERNOR SHALL NOTIFY THE REVISOR OF STATUTES IN WRITING OF THE DATE ON WHICH THE CONDITIONS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (2.5)(b)(I) OF THIS SECTION HAVE OCCURRED BY E-MAILING THE NOTICE TO REVISOROFSTATUTES.GA@STATE.CO.US. (III) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (2.5)(b), THE MOUNTAIN |
