A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING INCREASING THE AUTHORITY OF THE OFFICE OF
102 CONSUMER COUNSEL TO ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF CONSUMERS

Bill Summary

Currently, the office of consumer counsel (OCC) is authorized to intervene on behalf of customers of electric utilities and gas utilities in proceedings before the Colorado public utilities commission. The bill grants the OCC authority to speak for customers of providers of telecommunications, water, taxi and bus service, and all other services

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-6.5-101, **amend**
3 (3) as follows:

4 **40-6.5-101. Definitions.** As used in this article, unless the context
5 otherwise requires:

6 (3) "Public utility" ~~means an electric utility or gas utility~~ HAS THE
7 MEANING SET FORTH IN SECTION 40-1-103.

8 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
9 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
10 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
11 10, 2016, if adjournment sine die is on May 11, 2016); except that, if a
12 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
13 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
14 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
15 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
16 November 2016 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
17 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
