**BILL TOPIC:** COUNTIES PROHIBIT UNDERAGE NICOTINE POSSESSION

### Summary of Legislation

The bill allows counties to enact an ordinance or resolution prohibiting people under the age of 18 from possessing cigarettes or tobacco products, as is currently allowed for municipalities. Cities are also allowed to restrict possession of nicotine products by minors. In addition, the bill adds nicotine products to the current prohibition of cigarettes and tobacco products by a minor.

### Local Government Impact

To the extent that counties choose to adopt ordinances or resolutions prohibiting people under the age of 18 from possessing cigarettes, tobacco, or nicotine products, the bill increases costs to counties to conduct outreach for, administer, and enforce such an ordinance.

### Effective Date

The bill was lost on second reading in the House of Representatives on February 29, 2016.
