**Summary of Legislation**

The *reengrossed* bill requires the Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) to convene a stakeholder group to address various issues relating to freestanding emergency rooms, including appropriate regulation of such facilities; public education about primary, urgent, and emergency care; signs and notifications; costs and fees; and other matters as deemed necessary by the executive director of the CDPHE. The bill specifies the membership on the stakeholder group. The stakeholder group must convene by August 1, 2016. The CDPHE must provide a progress report to various legislative committees by January 1, 2017, and submit a final report of findings and recommendations by March 1, 2017.

**State Expenditures**

The bill results in one-time costs of \$17,000 in the CDPHE for staff to support and facilitate the stakeholder group. It is assumed a contractor would be used to conduct this work, including coordinating meetings and writing the required reports to the legislature. This cost can be paid from the existing fund balance in the General Licensure Cash Fund. Staff from the Division of Insurance in the Department of Regulatory Agencies (DORA) will also have additional work to serve on the stakeholder group. The fiscal note assumes these duties can be accomplished within existing appropriations to DORA.

**Effective Date**

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

**State Appropriation**

For FY 2016-17, the bill requires an appropriation of \$17,000 to the CDPHE from the General Licensure Cash Fund.
