**Fiscal Impact of Bill as Amended to Date**

The Senate Business, Labor, and Technology Committee Report (02/17/16) was a strike below to the introduced bill. The Committee Report maintained the Department of Public Health and Environment’s responsibilities related to complaint follow up, field inspections for product labeling, training and outreach, which were eliminated in the amendment on which the fiscal note was based. Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the amendments eliminate the Department of Public Health and Environment’s portion of the fiscal impact of the bill. The fiscal impact to the Department of Agriculture in the amount of \$3,800 General Fund for 40 hours of legal service costs remains the same as in the February 16, 2016 fiscal note.

**Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

**Description of Amendments in This Packet**

**J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$3,800 General Fund to the Department of Agriculture for FY 2016-17. This provision also reappropriates \$3,800 to the Department of Law for the provision of legal services to the Department of Agriculture.

**Points to Consider**

---

The general appropriations bill for FY 2016-17 has not yet been introduced. This bill is projected to increase cash fund revenues by \$300 for FY 2016-17, which would increase the amount required to be refunded under TABOR based on the most recent revenue forecasts. As TABOR refunds are paid from the General Fund, this bill would reduce the amount of General Fund available for other purposes.
