A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE DISTRIBUTION OF MEDICATIONS TO OUTLETS THAT**
102 **ARE UNDER COMMON OWNERSHIP OF CERTAIN ENTITIES.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Current law allows an accredited hospital, a prescription drug outlet operated by a health maintenance organization, and the state department of corrections to distribute compounded and prepackaged medications, without limitation, to pharmacies under common ownership of the entity. The bill allows these entities to distribute such medications to other outlets under common ownership of each entity as well.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-42.5-118, **amend**
3 (15)(b) introductory portion as follows:

4 **12-42.5-118. Compounding - dispensing - sale of drugs and**
5 **devices - rules - definition.** (15) (b) The following may distribute
6 compounded and prepackaged medications, without limitation, to
7 pharmacies AND OTHER OUTLETS under common ownership of the entity:

8 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
