BILL TOPIC: ANNUAL IN-SERVICE TRAINING FOR COUNTY SHERIFFS

NOTE: This revised fiscal note is provided to reflect amendments adopted by the House Judiciary Committee and new information provided by the Department of Law.

Summary of Legislation

Under current law, an elected or appointed sheriff, who is a certified peace officer, is required to complete 20 clock hours of in-service training annually. Under rule 28 of the Colorado Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) Board, 24 hours of annual in-service training are required for each certified peace officer. This bill, *as amended by the House Judiciary Committee*, clarifies that each sheriff must only meet the requirements for all certified peace officers, but in no case shall training hours be less than 20 hours. It also allows such training to be conducted by any other training agency approved by the POST Board.

Assessment

The bill aligns statute with current practice and is therefore assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed. It applies to years of a sheriff's term that commence on or after January 1, 2018.
