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**BILL TOPIC:** USE POST CASH FUND FOR MILITARY POLICE TRAINING

**NOTE:** This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

### Summary of Legislation

This bill broadens the use of Peace Officers Standards and Training (POST) Board Cash Fund training moneys to include military law enforcement personnel stationed in Colorado.

### Background and Assumptions

Under current law, moneys in the POST Board Cash Fund are used to provide training programs for peace officers. Primarily funded by a \$1 fee on motor vehicle registrations, the POST Board, a unit of the Attorney General's Office in the Department of Law, currently provides training grants of about \$3.9 million per year to support an estimated 13,000 peace officers. The bill does not alter the revenue or workload for the POST Board, but may alter the recipients of training grants to include certain federal law enforcement personnel.

### Local Government Impact

This bill may reduce training grants provided to local governments employing peace officers. The amount of any reduced funding and the specific jurisdictions affected in any given year will depend on the number of military law enforcement applications and awards.

### Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Judiciary Committee on April 18, 2017.
