A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE MEMBERSHIP EXPANSION OF THE COLORADO TASK
102 FORCE ON DRUNK AND IMPAIRED DRIVING.

Bill Summary

The bill adds to the Colorado task force on drunk and impaired driving:

- ! A community-based representative from the substance use disorder prevention field;
 - ! A representative from the marijuana enforcement division;

! A representative from the retail or medical marijuana industry who is an owner or manager of a retail dispensary. Each of these members are to be appointed by the executive director of the department of transportation or the director's designee.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-4-1306, **amend**
3 (3)(a)(IX) introductory portion and (3)(a)(IX)(K); and **add** (3)(a)(IX)(M),
4 (3)(a)(IX)(N), and (3)(a)(IX)(O) as follows:

5 **42-4-1306. Colorado task force on drunk and impaired driving**
6 **- creation - legislative declaration.** (3) (a) The task force shall consist
7 of:

8 (IX) The following members selected by the member serving
9 pursuant to ~~subparagraph (I) of this paragraph (a)~~ SUBSECTION (3)(a)(I)
10 OF THIS SECTION:

11 (K) A representative of a statewide organization that represents
12 alcohol and drug addiction counselors; **and**

13 (M) A COMMUNITY-BASED REPRESENTATIVE OF THE SUBSTANCE
14 USE DISORDER PREVENTION FIELD;

15 (N) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE'S
16 MARIJUANA ENFORCEMENT DIVISION; AND

17 (O) A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE RETAIL OR MEDICAL MARIJUANA
18 INDUSTRY WHO IS AN OWNER OR MANAGER OF A RETAIL DISPENSARY.

19 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act
20 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
21 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
22 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a
23 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the

1 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
2 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
3 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
4 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
5 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
