Bill Topic: REPORTING REQUIREMENTS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION & DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill continues reporting requirements in the Colorado Department of Transportation and the Colorado Department of Public Safety. It has been assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill. The bill was recommended by the Statutory Revision Committee.

Summary of Legislation

This bill continues reports from the Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) and the Colorado Department of Public Safety (CDPS) indefinitely.

Colorado Department of Transportation. The bill continues reporting requirements in CDOT regarding revenue expended from the State Highway Fund. The report includes proceeds allocated to the State Highway Fund from lease-purchase agreements made pursuant to Senate Bill 17-267.

Colorado Department of Public Safety. The bill continues reporting requirements for the Motorcycle Operator Safety Training (MOST) program in CDPS.

Background

Pursuant to current law, whenever Executive Branch agencies or the Judicial Branch are required to make a report on a periodic basis to the General Assembly, the reporting requirement expires three years after the first report was due, unless the General Assembly continues the requirement.

Assessment

This bill continues reports already conducted by the CDOT and the CDPS. It does not change the workload, expenditures, or revenue of the departments, and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 8, 2018, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 9, 2018, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
