The Public Health Care and Human Services Committee Report (04/27/18) adds language stating that money in the Housing Assistance for Persons Transitioning from the Criminal or Juvenile Justice System Cash Fund that is not expended at the end of the fiscal year remains available for expenditure in the next fiscal year without further appropriation. This amendment does not affect the fiscal impact identified in the attached Legislative Council Staff Fiscal Note. Legislative Council Staff agrees with this assessment.

Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes a provision appropriating \$60,788 reappropriated funds to the Department of Local Affair's Division of Housing for FY 2018-19. The source of funding is a transfer from the cash funds appropriation in the Long Bill from the Housing Assistance for Persons Transitioning from the Criminal or Juvenile Justice System Cash Fund. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 1.0 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The bill continues indefinitely the fiscal year-end transfer of unexpended General Fund that has been appropriated to the Department of Public Safety's Division of Criminal Justice for community corrections programs. Absent this bill, any unexpended money would remain in the General Fund.
