SENATE BILL 18-110

AN ACT

CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF THE REQUIREMENT THAT EACH STATE AGENCY ANNUALLY REPORT THE AMOUNT OF FEDERAL MONEY IT RECEIVED IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. The general assembly declares that the purpose of Senate Bill 18-110, enacted in 2018, is to remove obsolete provisions from statute by repealing section 24-75-212, Colorado Revised Statutes, concerning legislative reporting of federal money. The general assembly further declares that the provisions of section 24-75-212, Colorado Revised Statutes, are antiquated and obsolete because they relate to a reporting requirement that the general assembly previously repealed.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 24-75-212.

SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
