Bill Topic: LOCAL GOVERNMENT REGULATION OF FOOD TRUCKS

The bill allows organizations representing local governments to study the regulation of food trucks and report any recommendations to the General Assembly. The bill may increase workload for local governments in FY 2019-20.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

Under the bill, state and regional organizations representing local governments may study the regulation of food trucks for fire safety and health code compliance and meet with stakeholders to solicit input and recommendations. The organizations representing local governments may report to the General Assembly any findings, recommendations, or future legislative solutions on or before November 1, 2019. The bill is repealed September 1, 2020.

Local Government

The bill may increase workloads for the local governments that participate as stakeholders in the study with organizations representing local governments. Workload increases will vary based on jurisdiction and level of involvement.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 20, 2019, and takes effect August 2, 2019, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
