A BILL FOR AN ACT

101	CONCERNING THE STATEWIDE COMMUNICATION SYSTEM FOR
102	REFERRAL TO ESSENTIAL SERVICES, AND, IN CONNECTION
103	THEREWITH, MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

The bill amends with relocated provisions the human services referral service authorized by the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative to provide assistance through the dissemination of information to residents of Colorado about applicable programs and services provided by government, private, nonprofit, and faith-based organizations and local communities regarding emergency shelter and food, as well as human services programs.

The bill requires the department of human services (department) to award an annual grant of \$200,000 to the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative for human services referral services and specifies the purposes for which the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative and human services referral service provider may use the grant money.

The bill requires the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative to provide one or more specific duties described in the bill. Human services referral services include, in part, providing statewide referral services; enabling referrals through telephone, text, chat, and e-mail; providing trained professionals to perform problem assessments and service navigation; and providing information regarding vital services, such as food and shelter.

The bill requires annual reporting by the department to certain committees of the general assembly.

The bill includes an appropriation to the department of \$200,000 for the 2020-21 state fiscal year for the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, amend with
3	relocated provisions part 2 of article 11 of title 29 as follows:

5	HUMAN SERVICES REFERRAL SERVICE
6	29-11-201. Legislative declaration. The general assembly hereby
7	finds and declares that obtaining access to appropriate community-based
8	organizations and governmental agencies providing for human services
9	is a critical first step for many individuals and families of Colorado to
10	receiving the help and assistance they need. In 2000, in recognition of the
11	need to promote effective access to human services, the federal
12	communications commission reserved the three-digit telephone number
13	of 2-1-1 for access to community health and human services information.
14	The public utilities commission approved the use of a 2-1-1 number for
15	Colorado in October of 2002. and while four pilot sites are operating in
16	specified counties, there is a need for service in all counties of this state.

1 THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION ASSIGNED THE 2-1-1 DIAL CODE TO THE 2 COLORADO 2-1-1 COLLABORATIVE. The 2-1-1 human services referral 3 service is dedicated to providing individuals and families with referral 4 information to obtain nonemergency services such as food assistance, 5 shelter, job assistance, and low-cost health care, for those in need. Due to 6 the importance of the human services referral system and the need to 7 assure that this system is enabled in all areas of the state of Colorado, the 8 general assembly hereby finds and declares that the human THE 2-1-1 9 HUMAN services referral service providers should receive protection of 10 immunity that is similar to the protection afforded to the 9-1-1 emergency 11 service

 REPORTING HOTLINE FOR ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES REFERRALS.

8 (2) ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING HUMAN SERVICES REFERRAL
9 SERVICES SHALL BE PROVIDED THROUGH THE COLORADO 2-1-1
10 COLLABORATIVE:

11 (a) A STATEWIDE REFERRAL SYSTEM THAT SERVES AND IS
12 AVAILABLE TO ALL CONSTITUENTS IN COLORADO, PROVIDING
13 BORDER-TO-BORDER COVERAGE THAT IS, AT A MINIMUM:

(I) STAFFED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE OPERATIONAL HOURS OF
STATE GOVERNMENT OFFICES IN ORDER TO OFFER LIVE RESOURCES; AND
(II) AVAILABLE FOR SELF-SERVICE TWENTY-FOUR HOURS PER DAY,
SEVEN DAYS PER WEEK;

(b) PUBLIC ACCESS VIA A WEBSITE TO A COMPREHENSIVE
DATABASE OF NONEMERGENCY HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES PROGRAMS
AND SERVICES PROVIDED BY GOVERNMENTAL, NONPROFIT, AND
FAITH-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND BY LOCAL COMMUNITIES THAT ARE
AVAILABLE TO RESIDENTS OF COLORADO;

23 (c) PUBLIC ACCESS TO THE STATEWIDE HUMAN SERVICES REFERRAL
 24 SERVICE VIA TELEPHONE, TEXT, CHAT, AND E-MAIL;

25 (d) HELP TO COLORADANS IN FINDING VITAL SERVICES SUCH AS
26 EMERGENCY SHELTER, FOOD, AND RENTAL AND UTILITY ASSISTANCE; AND
27 (e) ACCESS TO TRAINED PROFESSIONALS TO PERFORM PROBLEM

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ASSESSMENTS AND SERVICE NAVIGATION FROM EVERYDAY CONCERNS TO
 MAJOR LIFE-CHANGING EVENTS, AND TO COLLECT INFORMATION FROM THE
 CLIENT TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THE CLIENT'S SITUATION AND TO OFFER
 APPROPRIATE REFERRALS TO AGENCIES THAT MAY HELP.

5 (3) THE COLORADO 2-1-1 COLLABORATIVE SHALL USE GRANT 6 MONEY AWARDED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION FOR PLANNING, TRAINING, 7 STAFFING, TECHNOLOGY, ACCREDITATION, AND SYSTEM EVALUATION AND 8 FOR COLLECTING, ORGANIZING, AND MAINTAINING INFORMATION FROM 9 STATE AGENCIES, DEPARTMENTS, AND PROGRAMS THAT PROVIDE HUMAN 10 SERVICES FOR ACCESS BY THE HUMAN SERVICES REFERRAL SERVICE 11 PROVIDER.

12 (4) BEGINNING IN THE 2020-21 FISCAL YEAR, THE GENERAL
13 ASSEMBLY SHALL ANNUALLY APPROPRIATE TWO HUNDRED THOUSAND
14 DOLLARS FOR THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO COLORADANS AS DESCRIBED

1 incurred as a result of any act or omission of the Colorado 2-1-1 2 collaborative, human services referral service provider, or any employee 3 or agent thereof in connection with developing, adopting, authorizing, 4 implementing, maintaining, enhancing, or operating a referral service 5 unless such damage or injury was intentionally caused by or resulted from 6 gross negligence of the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative, human services 7 referral service provider, employee, agent, or financial supporter in 8 connection with the provision of human services referral service.

9 (2) No THE Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative, human services referral 10 service provider or employee, agent, or financial supporter thereof shall 11 be IS NOT liable to any person or entity for infringement or invasion of the 12 right of privacy of any person caused or claimed to have been caused, 13 directly or indirectly, by any act or omission in connection with the 14 provision of human service referral information to any person or entity 15 unless the infringement or invasion of the right of privacy arose out of the 16 gross negligence or other wrongful and intentional act of the Colorado 17 2-1-1 collaborative, human services referral service provider, employee, 18 agent, or financial supporter thereof.

19 SECTION 2. Appropriation. For the 2020-21 state fiscal year, 20 \$200,000 is appropriated to the department of human services. This 21 appropriation is from the general fund. To implement this act, the 22 department may use this appropriation for the human services referral 23 service established pursuant to part 2 of article 11 of title 29, C.R.S.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
