Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates \$200,000 General Fund to the Department of Human Services for FY 2020-21.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

- **J.001** Staff has prepared amendment **J.001** (attached) to make technical changes to the existing clause to direct funds to a new line item in the executive director's office.
- **L.004** Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) increases the appropriation for the Department of Human Services to \$500,000 for FY 2019-20, and specifies that this amount come from the CARES Act subfund in the General Fund. The amendment also adds provisions specifying that funds unexpended prior to July 1, 2020 are further appropriated through December 30, 2020.

Additionally, the amendment removes language in the introduced bill that created an annual state grant to the Colorado 2-1-1 collaborative for human services referral services, listed duties of the human services referral system, and required ongoing reporting.

If L.004 is adopted, J.001 should not be adopted.

Points to Consider

Other Considerations

The bill appropriates CARES Act funds through December 30, 2020. If programs and services initiated by CARES Act funds continue beyond December 30, 2020, General Fund would be required to cover the ongoing costs.
