## Summary of Legislation

The bill expands the definition of "state agency" for the purposes of the Statewide Internet Portal Authority (SIPA). State agency includes the executive, judicial, and legislative branches of government, as well as institutions of higher education.

## Background and Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The General Assembly created SIPA in 2004 to provide efficient, effective, and user friendly e-government services to the state and local governments. However, with the creation of the Office of Information Technology in 2008, the definition of state agency that applied to SIPA's services was modified to cover only executive branch agencies. The bill restores the definition of state agency in the SIPA statutes to its original scope and will result in no change to state revenue or expenditures. For this reason, the bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on July 8, 2020.
