A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROTECTION OF CRITICAL SERVICES THROUGH THE CREATION OF SUSTAINABLE MEDICAID TRANSPORTATION

103 SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Current law requires the public utilities commission (commission) to oversee the safety and oversight of medicaid nonmedical and nonemergency medical transportation services (transportation services). The bill eliminates the commission's responsibility to oversee the safety and oversight of the transportation services.

The bill requires the department of health care policy and financing (department) to oversee the safety and oversight of the transportation services. The bill also requires the department to collaborate with stakeholders to establish rules and processes for the transportation services.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add part 8 to article 3 1 of title 25.5 as follows: 4 PART 8 5 MEDICAID NONMEDICAL AND NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION 6 7 **25.5-1-801. Definitions.** As used in this section, unless the 8 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: 9 "NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION" MEANS (1) 10 TRANSPORTATION TO OR FROM MEDICALLY NECESSARY NONEMERGENCY 11 TREATMENT. 12 (2) "NONMEDICAL TRANSPORTATION" MEANS TRANSPORTATION TO 13 ENABLE PASSENGERS WHO ARE RECIPIENTS OF MEDICAID TO GAIN ACCESS 14 TO WAIVER AND OTHER COMMUNITY SERVICES, ACTIVITIES, AND 15 RESOURCES. 16 "TRANSPORTATION SERVICES" MEANS NONEMERGENCY (3) 17 MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION OR NONMEDICAL TRANSPORTATION SERVICES 18 PROVIDED TO MEDICAID RECIPIENTS. 19 25.5-1-802. 21	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-105, amend
22	(1) introductory portion, (1)(j), and (1)(k); and add (1)(l) as follows:
23	40-10.1-105. Transportation not subject to regulation. (1) The
24	following types of transportation are not subject to regulation under this
25	article ARTICLE 10.1:
26	(j) Transportation performed by the federal government, a state,
27	or any agency or political subdivision of either, whether through an

2	(k) Transportation of repossessed property by a secured creditor
3	or assignee, or by a repossessor on behalf of a secured creditor or

5	(1) TRANSPORTATION BY MOTOR VEHICLES USED FOR NONMEDICAL
6	TRANSPORTATION AND NONEMERGENCY MEDICAL TRANSPORTATION
7	PROVIDED THROUGH MEDICAID PURSUANT TO SECTION 25.5-1-802.
8	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-110, amend
9	(1)(a) as follows:
10	40-10.1-110. Criminal history record check - rules. (1) (a) An
11	individual who wishes to drive: A taxicab for a motor carrier that is the
12	holder of a certificate to provide taxicab service issued under part 2 of
13	this article 10.1; a motor vehicle for a motor carrier that is the holder of
14	a permit to operate as a charter bus, children's activity bus, luxury
15	limousine, medicaid client transport, or off-road scenic charter under part
16	3 of this article 10.1; or a motor vehicle for a motor carrier that is the
17	holder of a permit to operate as a large-market taxicab service under part
18	7 of this article 10.1 must have the individual's fingerprints taken by a
19	local law enforcement agency or any third party approved by the
20	Colorado bureau of investigation for the purpose of obtaining a
21	fingerprint-based criminal history record check.
22	SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-301, repeal
23	(9), (10), and (11) as follows:
24	40-10.1-301. Definitions. As used in this part 3, unless the
25	context otherwise requires:
26	(9) "Medicaid client transport" means a motor vehicle that
27	transports passengers who are recipients of medicaid pursuant to articles

1 4 to 6 of title 25.5, C.R.S., and are being transported under a medicaid 2 nonemergent medical transportation contract or a medicaid nonmedical 3 transportation contract. 4 (10) "Medicaid nonemergent medical transportation contract" 5 means a contract or provider agreement with the department of health 6 care policy and financing or its approved agent for the purpose of 7 providing nonemergent medical transportation to approved recipients of 8 medicaid. 9 (11) "Medicaid nonmedical transportation contract" means a 10 contract or provider agreement with the department of health care policy 11 and financing or its approved agent for the purpose of providing 12 nonmedical transportation to approved recipients of medicaid. 13 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 40-10.1-302, amend 14 (1)(a); and **repeal** (2)(b) as follows: 15 **40-10.1-302. Permit requirements.** (1) (a) A person shall not 16 operate or offer to operate a charter bus, children's activity bus, fire crew 17 transport, luxury limousine, medicaid client transport, or off-road scenic 18 charter in intrastate commerce without first having obtained a permit 19 therefor from the commission in accordance with this part 3. 20 (2) (b) (I) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (a) of this 21 subsection (2), a person applying for a medicaid client transport permit 22 shall provide the commission proof of a medicaid client transport 23 agreement with the department of health care policy and financing or its 24 approved agent in such form and with such information as the 25 commission may require. 26 (II) The department of health care policy and financing may 27 transfer medicaid money to the commission to assist the commission in

 commission receives from the department of health care policy and
 financing is continuously appropriated to the commission.

 SECTION 6. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
- 6 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
