101 **CONCERNING A TRANSFER FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE STATE**
102 **HIGHWAY FUND.**

Bill Summary

On July 1, 2021, the bill requires the state treasurer to transfer \$124 million from the general fund to the state highway fund.

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-219, **add** (7)
2 as follows:

3 **24-75-219. Transfers - transportation - capital construction -**
4 **definitions - repeal.** (7) ON JULY 1, 2021, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL
5 TRANSFER ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FOUR MILLION DOLLARS FROM THE
6 GENERAL FUND TO THE STATE HIGHWAY FUND.

7 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
8 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
