Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates a total of \$2,000,000 to the Department of Local Affairs for FY 2021-22, including \$1,000,000 General Fund appropriated to the Peace Officers Mental Health Support and Community Partnership Fund and \$1,000,000 reappropriated funds from that fund to the Department of Local Affairs to support the grant program. The current appropriations clause does not include the associated 0.5 FTE identified in the Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note (05/14/21).

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.002 Staff has prepared amendment J.002 (attached) to add a provision stating that the JBC Staff Fiscal Analysis 1

appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.5 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2021-22 based on the March 2021 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package includes a set aside of \$48.0 million General Fund for bills that require General Fund appropriations for FY 2021-22. This bill requires a General Fund appropriation of \$1,000,000 for FY 2021-22, reducing the \$48.0 million set aside by the same amount.
