The bill permits the Department of Public Health and Environment to dispense up to 25 percent of certain grants immediately. It increases state workload on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows the Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE), in contracting with certain grantees for the provision of services, to dispense up to 25 percent of the total value of the contract's payments immediately upon the execution or renewal of the contract.

Background

CDPHE's grant programs operate as reimbursements for invoiced expenses, which thus requires grantees to fund expenses before receiving reimbursement. Permitting CDPHE to award some grant funds in advance of services performed may allow additional organizations to pursue contracts.

State Expenditures

The bill increases workload for CDPHE to establish criteria for eligible organizations and monitor contracts. This workload can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
