The bill allows boards of county commissioners to require registration of businesses in unincorporated parts of the county. The bill may increase local expenditures on an ongoing basis.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: This revised fiscal note reflects the reengrossed bill.

Summary of Legislation

The bill gives a local board of county commissioners the authority to register businesses in the unincorporated portions of the county. However, the bill does not grant a board of commissioners the power to license or collect fees or fines for such registrations. Counties may only publish registration information if it is aggregated by business type.

Local Government

Starting in FY 2021-22, when a county requires business registration in unincorporated areas, administrative and legal costs will increase.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
