A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE AUTHORITY OF A HOSPITAL TO DISPENSE A**
102 **SEVEN-DAY SUPPLY OF DRUGS TO A VICTIM OF SEXUAL ASSAULT**
103 **IN ORDER TO TREAT SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS.**

Bill Summary

The bill allows a hospital employee or agent to dispense a 7-day supply of drugs for prophylaxis of sexually transmitted infections to an emergency room patient who is a victim of sexual assault.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-280-120, **amend**
3 (10)(a) as follows:

4 **12-280-120. Compounding - dispensing - sale of drugs and**
5 **devices - rules - definition.** (10) (a) (I) Any hospital employee or agent
6 authorized by law to administer or dispense medications may dispense a
7 seventy-two-hour supply of drugs on the specific order of a practitioner
8 to a registered emergency room patient.

9 (II) NOTWITHSTANDING SUBSECTION (10)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION,
10 IF THE HOSPITAL EMPLOYEE OR AGENT DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION
11 (10)(a)(I) OF THIS SECTION IS TREATING A REGISTERED EMERGENCY ROOM
12 PATIENT FOR SEXUAL ASSAULT, THE HOSPITAL EMPLOYEE OR AGENT MAY,
13 IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES OF THE FEDERAL CENTERS FOR
14 DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION, DISPENSE BETWEEN A SEVEN-DAY
15 AND TWENTY-EIGHT-DAY SUPPLY OF DRUGS FOR PROPHYLAXIS OF
16 SEXUALLY TRANSMITTED INFECTIONS TO THE PATIENT.

17 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
18 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
19 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
