Summary of Legislation

The bill requires that assisted living residence referral agencies provide prospective residents with their privacy policy and documentation that the prospective resident has the right to request not to be contacted in the future by the agency. The bill also modifies documentation and contract requirements, and requires that a referral agency not refer a prospective resident to more than a reasonable number of residences with the intent to deny other referral agencies a referral fee.

State Expenditures

The bill may minimally impact workload in the Consumer Protection section of the Department of Law. The bill modifies certain documentation requirements, which may result in a change in the number of complaints received. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect 90 days following adjournment of the General Assembly sine die, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
