**Bill Topic:** JURY APPRECIATION DAY

---

**Summary of Fiscal Impact:** **No fiscal impact.** The bill establishes Jury Appreciation Day. The bill does not impact state and local expenditures and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

---

**Appropriation Summary:** No appropriation required.

---

**Fiscal Note Status:** The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

## Summary of Legislation

The bill establishes September 5 as “Jury Appreciation Day,” an observed state holiday.

## Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

Observed holidays, unlike legal holidays, do not impact hours worked for state employees. The observed holiday may shift the school year calendar for any school district that chooses to give students the day off. Such observed holidays do not impact state revenues or expenditures, and thus this additional observed holiday is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

## Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on May 24, 2023, and takes effect on August 7, 2023, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
