A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING HIGHER EDUCATION TUITION ASSISTANCE RELATED TO 102 SERVICE IN THE COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

Under existing law, the department of military and veterans affairs (department) pays up to the full amount of tuition for members of the Colorado National Guard (members) pursuing a degree or certificate at certain institutions of higher education via a tuition assistance program (program). The tuition is paid from the Colorado National Guard tuition assistance fund (fund).

The bill expands the program to include spouses and children (dependents) of members and to pay for fees charged by the institution of higher education. To qualify for tuition assistance, a dependent must be a dependent of a member who has served in the Colorado National Guard for at least 6 years and either is serving during the period of time that the dependent is receiving tuition and fee assistance or previously served in the Colorado National Guard for at least 12 years.

The bill creates the National Guard dependents tuition assistance account (account) in the fund. Tuition for dependents is paid from the account. If the balance in the account is more than the amount necessary to pay for dependents' tuition in a fiscal year and the money in the fund is insufficient to satisfy the demand for tuition assistance for members, the adjutant general of the department may notify the state treasurer to transfer excess money from the account to the fund to pay for members' tuition assistance.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

5 (1.5) and (9)(a.5) as follows:

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23-7.4-302. Tuition and fees for Colorado National Guard members and dependents - military regulations - legislative declaration - definitions. (1.5) As used in this section, unless the context otherwise requires:

- (a) "ACCOUNT" MEANS THE NATIONAL GUARD DEPENDENTS TUITION ASSISTANCE ACCOUNT, CREATED IN SUBSECTION (9)(a.5) OF THIS SECTION, IN THE COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD TUITION ASSISTANCE FUND.
- (b) "DEPENDENT" MEANS A SPOUSE OF AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF THE COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD OR A CHILD UNDER TWENTY-SIX YEARS OF AGE EITHER BORN TO OR LEGALLY ADOPTED BY AN ACTIVE MEMBER.
- (c) "DESIGNATED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION" MEANS THE

- 16 (d) "Fund" means the Colorado National Guard Tuition 17 Assistance fund created in Subsection (9) of this section.
- 18 (e) "MEMBER" MEANS AN ENLISTED MEMBER OR OFFICER OF THE
 19 COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD.
- 20 (f) "TUITION" INCLUDES FEES CHARGED TO A STUDENT BY A
 21 DESIGNATED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION.

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(2) (a) Any person who is A member of the Colorado National Guard OR A DEPENDENT OF A MEMBER, upon being accepted for enrollment at any designated institution of higher education, is permitted to pursue studies leading toward a bachelor's degree, a postgraduate degree, an associate degree, or a certificate of completion with at least fifty percent but not more than one hundred percent of the cost of tuition

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1	AND FEES CHARGED BY THE DESIGNATED INSTITUTION OF HIGHER
2	EDUCATION paid by the department of military and veterans affairs,
3	subject to available appropriations, for so long as the person MEMBER
4	remains a member of the Colorado National Guard, but the DEPARTMENT
5	SHALL NOT MAKE tuition payments shall not be made for more than one
6	hundred thirty-two semester hours or one hundred ninety-eight quarter
7	hours or for more than eight years.
8	(a.5) A member OR DEPENDENT is eligible for tuition assistance
9	pursuant to this section to the extent that the sum of the member's OR
10	DEPENDENT'S tuition assistance from all sources, including the federal
11	government, does not exceed one hundred percent of the cost of tuition.
12	(b) In order to qualify for the tuition assistance authorized by this
13	section, a member PERSON:
14	(I) Must meet the criteria for eligibility, as established by rules
15	and MILITARY regulations promulgated pursuant to subsection (7) of this
16	section;
17	(II) Must not be drawing tuition from any other tuition assistance
18	program funded by a private AN employer that, when combined with the
19	assistance in this section, would exceed one hundred percent of the tuition
20	costs;
21	(III) Must not be a recipient of a full scholarship for tuition and
22	fees to any designated institution of higher education; and
23	(IV) IF THE PERSON IS A MEMBER, must serve in the Colorado
24	National Guard during the period of time that the member is receiving
25	tuition and fee assistance; AND
26	(V) IF THE PERSON IS A DEPENDENT, MUST BE ENROLLED IN THE
27	FEDERAL DEFENSE ENROLLMENT ELIGIBILITY REPORTING SYSTEM.

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1	ADDITIONALLY, A DEPENDENT MUST BE A DEPENDENT OF A MEMBER WHO
2	EITHER:
3	(A) Is serving in the Colorado National Guard during the
4	PERIOD OF TIME THAT THE DEPENDENT IS RECEIVING TUITION AND FEE
5	ASSISTANCE AND HAS SERVED IN THE COLORADO NATIONAL GUARD FOR

9	(d) For purposes of this section, "member" means an enlisted
10	member or officer of the National Guard.
11	(3) (a) For purposes of this section, "designated institution of
12	higher education" means the Colorado state university - Pueblo, Adams
13	state university, Colorado Mesa university, Metropolitan state university
14	of Denver, Fort Lewis college, Western Colorado university, all
15	independent area technical colleges, all local district colleges, the
16	university of northern Colorado, the university of Colorado at Boulder,
17	the university of Colorado at Denver, the university of Colorado at
18	Colorado Springs, Colorado state university, Colorado state university -
19	global campus, the Colorado school of mines, the university of Colorado
20	health sciences center, all community colleges governed by the state
21	board for community colleges and occupational education, and any
22	private institution of higher education in Colorado that qualifies for the
23	college opportunity fund pursuant to article 18 of this title 23 and that
24	offers an accredited certificate or degree program in homeland security.
25	For a member of the Colorado National Guard OR DEPENDENT enrolled in
26	a private institution of higher education, tuition assistance is limited to the
27	completion of the accredited certificate or degree program in homeland

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security and is provided at the discretion of the adjutant general of the department of military and veterans affairs.

OR DEPENDENT who is a continuing student and who is receiving tuition assistance as provided in this section, the department of military and veterans affairs shall MUST obtain certification from the designated institution of higher education prior to the payment to the institution attesting to the member's OR DEPENDENT'S current satisfactory academic standing at the designated institution of higher education, as determined by military regulations promulgated pursuant to subsection (7) of this section, for each semester or quarter for which tuition assistance is requested. The DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS SHALL NOT GRANT tuition assistance shall not be granted without such RECEIVING THE certification.

(6) Any member who leaves the Colorado National Guard in violation of the member's agreement under subsection (2) of this section OR DEPENDENT WHO CEASES TO SATISFY THE CRITERIA SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (2)(b)(V) OF THIS SECTION during an academic term for which the member OR DEPENDENT is receiving tuition assistance is required to SHALL repay to the department of military and veterans affairs the amount of tuition assistance granted for that academic term and any and all collection fees COSTS incurred by the department of military and veterans affairs. The repayment of tuition assistance shall be credited to THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS SHALL TRANSMIT TUITION ASSISTANCE REPAYMENTS IT RECEIVES PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (6) TO THE STATE TREASURER, WHO SHALL CREDIT THE MONEY TO the Colorado National Guard tuition fund created in subsection

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(9) of this section IF THE REPAYMENT IS FROM A MEMBER OR TO THE ACCOUNT IF THE REPAYMENT IS FROM A DEPENDANT.

- (7) The department of military and veterans affairs shall promulgate military regulations for the administration of tuition assistance FOR MEMBERS AND DEPENDENTS as provided in this section, including, but not limited to, the following:
- (a) Criteria for the eligibility of a member of the National Guard OR DEPENDENT OF A MEMBER for tuition assistance. In establishing this criteria, the department of military and veterans affairs shall include, but not be limited to, consideration of the following:
- (b) Procedures to be followed by FOR designated institutions of higher education in reporting TO REPORT the member's OR DEPENDENT'S academic standing and in providing PROVIDE timely billing to the department of military and veterans affairs;
- (c) A definition of satisfactory academic standing, including, but not limited to, consideration of the member's OR DEPENDENT'S cumulative grade point average, credit hours completed, and progress toward a degree.
- (9) (a) There is created in the state treasury the Colorado National Guard tuition fund which is administered by the department of military and veterans affairs. and which THE FUND consists of all money that may be appropriated thereto by the general assembly, or that is otherwise made available to it by the general assembly. Money "otherwise made available" includes any repayment of REPAID tuition assistance made MONEY CREDITED TO THE FUND pursuant to subsection (6) of this section, MONEY TRANSFERRED TO THE FUND PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (9)(a.5)(II) OF THIS SECTION, AND ANY OTHER MONEY THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

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MAY APPROPRIATE OR TRANSFER TO THE FUND. The money in the fund is continuously appropriated for the payment of tuition assistance FOR MEMBERS as provided in this section. Any money not expended at the end of the fiscal year remains in the fund and shall not be transferred to or revert to the general fund of the state.

(a.5) (I) THE NATIONAL GUARD DEPENDENTS TUITION ASSISTANCE ACCOUNT IS CREATED IN THE FUND. THE ACCOUNT CONSISTS OF ANY MONEY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE OR TRANSFER INTO THE ACCOUNT AND REPAID TUITION ASSISTANCE MONEY CREDITED TO THE ACCOUNT PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION (6) OF THIS SECTION. THE MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT IS CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED FOR THE PAYMENT OF TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR DEPENDENTS AS PROVIDED IN THIS SECTION.

(II) THE ADJUTANT GENERAL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AND VETERANS AFFAIRS MAY DETERMINE THE ACCOUNT'S EXCESS BALANCE, WHICH IS THE AMOUNT OF MONEY IN THE ACCOUNT IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNT NECESSARY TO PAY FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR DEPENDENTS IN A FISCAL YEAR. IF THE ADJUTANT GENERAL DETERMINES THAT THE ACCOUNT HAS AN EXCESS BALANCE AND THAT THE AMOUNT OF MONEY IN THE FUND IS INSUFFICIENT TO SATISFY THE DEMAND FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR MEMBERS, THE ADJUTANT GENERAL MAY NOTIFY THE STATE TREASURER, IN WRITING, OF THE AMOUNT OF THE ACCOUNT'S EXCESS BALANCE THAT CAN BE USED FOR TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR MEMBERS IN THAT FISCAL YEAR. UPON RECEIVING NOTIFICATION FROM THE ADJUTANT GENERAL, THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER THAT AMOUNT FROM THE ACCOUNT TO THE FUND.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the

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- ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly; except
- 2 that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V
- 3 of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this
- 4 act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take
- 5 effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
- 6 November 2024 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
