A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING TRANSPARENCY REQUIREMENTS FOR INSTITUTIONS OF

102 HIGHER EDUCATION.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov.</u>)

The bill adds the following rights to the rights of higher education students:

- Cost transparency regarding a postsecondary education program;
- A timely response on whether transfer credit will be accepted by a public institution of higher education

(institution); and

• The right to appeal an institution's decision not to accept a student's request to transfer credits.

The bill makes changes to the statewide common course numbering system to guarantee certain course transfer credits between community colleges, local district colleges, and area technical colleges.

The bill requires the department of higher edcation to establish an appeal process if an institution wrongfully denies a student's transfer credit.

The bill requires an institution to issue a decision to a student regarding the acceptance or denial of transfer credits within 30 days after the date the student submits a request for transfer credit.

Beginning January 1, 2025, the bill requires an institution to provide a financial aid and cost disclosure form to a student prior to the student decision deadline to accept admission to the institution.

14	SCHOLARSHIPS, GRANTS, AND LOANS;

13	to transfer among all state-supported institutions of higher education
14	INSTITUTIONS is critical to their success in achieving a degree. The
15	general assembly further finds that it is necessary for the state to have
16	sound transfer policies that provide the broadest and simplest mechanisms
17	feasible while protecting the academic quality of the institutions of higher
18	education and their undergraduate degree programs. The general
19	assembly finds, therefore, that it is in the best interests of the state for the
20	commission to oversee the adoption of a statewide articulation matrix
21	system of course numbering for general education courses THE
22	GUARANTEED TRANSFER PATHWAY MATRIX, that WHICH includes all

2	(d.7) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2025, AND EVERY OCTOBER 1

20	a representative of the commission. The commission shall consult with
21	the governing boards when convening representatives from the higher
22	education institutions. By July 1, 2011, the council shall create a process
23	through which it shall seek input from and consult with various higher
24	education student organizations for each articulation agreement and for
25	the review of general education courses and the course numbering system
26	as required in paragraph (c) of this subsection (3) COURSES IN THE

7	to the commission a list of general education courses to be included in the
8	course numbering system GUARANTEED TRANSFER PATHWAY MATRIX. In
9	identifying said general education THE courses, the council shall review
10	the course descriptions and may request summaries of course syllabi for
11	review, focusing first on lower-division general education courses. The
12	commission shall review the council's recommendations and adopt a
13	statewide articulation matrix system of common course numbering
14	GUARANTEED TRANSFER PATHWAY MATRIX for general education courses,
15	including criteria for such THE courses, on or before January 1, 2003.
16	(II) The council shall annually review the list of general education
17	courses and the course numbering system GUARANTEED TRANSFER
18	PATHWAY MATRIX, including the criteria, adopted by the commission and
19	recommend such changes as may be necessary to maintain the accuracy
20	and integrity of the course numbering system GUARANTEED TRANSFER
21	PATHWAY MATRIX. The council's annual review shall MUST include
22	consideration of the course descriptions, and the council may request
23	summaries of course syllabi for further review.
24	(4) (a) Following adoption of the course numbering system, each
25	higher education institution shall review its course offerings and identify

11	(b) PRIOR TO AN ENFORCEMENT ACTION PURSUANT TO SUBSECTION
12	(8)(a) OF THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE A NOTICE OF
13	VIOLATION TO THE INSTITUTION AND EXPLAIN HOW THE INSTITUTION MAY
14	REMEDY THE VIOLATION, IF POSSIBLE. IF THE INSTITUTION FAILS TO
15	REMEDY THE VIOLATION WITHIN THREE MONTHS AFTER RECEIPT OF THE
16	NOTICE OF VIOLATION, THE DEPARTMENT MAY BRING AN ENFORCEMENT
17	ACTION AGAINST THE INSTITUTION.
18	(c) The department has the authority to overturn a
19	COURSE TRANSFER DECISION MADE BY AN INSTITUTION THAT IS IN
20	VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION.
21	(d) A STUDENT ENROLLED AT AN INSTITUTION MAY APPEAL AN
22	INSTITUTION'S DECISION REGARDING THE DENIAL OF CREDIT FOR COURSES
23	IN THE GUARANTEED TRANSFER PATHWAY MATRIX THAT THE STUDENT
24	SEEKS TO TRANSFER THROUGH AN APPEALS PROCESS ESTABLISHED BY THE
25	DEPARTMENT.
26	(e) THE DEPARTMENT MAY PROMULGATE RULES AS NECESSARY TO
27	<u>IMPLEMENT THIS SUBSECTION (8).</u>

1	SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 23-5-150 as
2	<u>follows:</u>
3	23-5-150. Transfer credit review process and nontransferable
4	credit - notice - definition. (1) AN INSTITUTION SHALL PROVIDE A
5	STUDENT SEEKING TO TRANSFER CREDIT FROM THE INSTITUTION WITH A
6	DETERMINATION REGARDING THE ACCEPTANCE OR DENIAL OF THE
7	STUDENT'S REQUEST AND REQUIRED DOCUMENTATION FOR TRANSFER
8	CREDIT WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE DATE THE STUDENT SUBMITS A

23	institutions shall provide ENSURE that credits earned at each of the
24	constituent institutions shall be ARE transferable between institutions
25	insofar as they meet the degree and grade requirements of the student's
26	chosen program of studies at one of the constituent institutions as
27	determined by the degree-granting institution AS REQUIRED BY SECTION

SECTION 5. Safety clause. The general assembly finds,
determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
institutions.
