Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill requires but does not contain an appropriation clause.

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Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$500,000 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.

L.004 and J.002

Bill Sponsor amendment **L.004** (attached) amends the bill to state the General Assembly shall appropriate \$250,000 General Fund for the program on an annual basis, and allows the Department to receive gifts, grants, and donations to implement the program. Staff has prepared amendment **J.002** (attached) to add a provision appropriating a total of \$250,000 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2024-25. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.3 FTE.

If the Committee adopts L.004, it should adopt J.002 and should NOT adopt J.001.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2024-25 based on the March 2024 Office of State Planning and Budgeting (OSPB) revenue forecast. The budget package includes \$63.1 million in set-asides for legislation outside of the package (see table below). The budget package accounts for the 15.0 percent reserve associated with the placeholders (a total of \$9.5 million).
