A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE RIGHT OF A CONSUMER TO CANCEL AUTOMATIC**
102 **RENEWAL CONTRACTS ONLINE.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. Under current law, if a consumer consents to an automatic renewal contract for a good or service through an online medium, the person that sells the good or service may provide the consumer with an opportunity to cancel the automatic renewal contract either online or in person.

The bill changes this provision to state that the person that sells the good or service is required to provide the consumer with an opportunity

to cancel the automatic renewal contract online if the consumer consented to the automatic renewal contract through an online medium.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 6-1-732, **repeal and**
3 **reenact, with amendments, (2)(d); and add (7)** as follows:

4 **6-1-732. Automatic renewal contracts - unlawful acts -**
5 **required disclosures - right to cancel - trial period offers - exemptions**
6 **- rules - definitions.** (2) It is unlawful for a person that offers an
7 automatic renewal contract to a consumer in this state to:

8 (d) FAIL TO PROVIDE A SIMPLE, COST-EFFECTIVE, TIMELY,
9 EASY-TO-USE, AND READILY ACCESSIBLE MECHANISM FOR CANCELING AN
10 AUTOMATIC RENEWAL CONTRACT OR TRIAL PERIOD OFFER. A PERSON IS
11 DEEMED TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBSECTION (2)(d) IF THE PERSON OFFERS:

12 (I) A ONE-STEP ONLINE CANCELLATION LINK TO A CONSUMER WHO
13 CONSENTED TO THE AUTOMATIC RENEWAL CONTRACT OR TRIAL PERIOD
14 OFFER THROUGH A WEBSITE OR OTHER ONLINE MEDIUM OR THROUGH AN
15 ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION, AND THE ONE-STEP ONLINE CANCELLATION
16 LINK IS:

17 (A) LOCATED ON THE PERSON'S WEBSITE OR CONTAINED IN AN
18 ELECTRONIC DEVICE OR SERVICE OR AN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION
19 MADE TO THE CONSUMER; AND

20 (B) AVAILABLE TO THE CONSUMER IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE
21 CONSUMER COMPLETES A REASONABLE AUTHENTICATION PROTOCOL USED
22 SOLELY TO CONFIRM THAT THE CONSUMER IS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE
23 CHANGES TO THE ACCOUNT; OR

24 (II) ONE OF THE FOLLOWING MEANS OF CANCELING THE
25 AUTOMATIC RENEWAL CONTRACT TO THE CONSUMER IF THE CONSUMER

1 CONSENTED TO THE AUTOMATIC RENEWAL CONTRACT OR TRIAL PERIOD
2 OFFER THROUGH MEANS OTHER THAN THOSE LISTED IN SUBSECTION
3 (2)(d)(I) OF THIS SECTION:

4 (A) A ONE-STEP ONLINE CANCELLATION LINK THAT IS LOCATED ON
5 THE PERSON'S WEBSITE OR CONTAINED IN AN ELECTRONIC DEVICE OR
6 SERVICE OR AN ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATION MADE TO THE CONSUMER
7 AND AVAILABLE TO THE CONSUMER IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE CONSUMER
8 COMPLETES A REASONABLE AUTHENTICATION PROTOCOL USED SOLELY TO
9 CONFIRM THAT THE CONSUMER IS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE CHANGES TO THE
10 ACCOUNT; OR

11 (B) AN IN-PERSON MECHANISM FOR CANCELING AN AUTOMATIC
12 RENEWAL CONTRACT OR TRIAL PERIOD OFFER THAT IS AT A PHYSICAL
13 LOCATION WHERE THE CONSUMER REGULARLY UTILIZES ANY GOODS OR
14 SERVICES THAT ARE SUBJECT TO THE AUTOMATIC RENEWAL CONTRACT
15 AND SATISFIES THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBSECTION (2)(d).

16 (7) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY ADOPT RULES AS NECESSARY
17 FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPLEMENTING AND ENFORCING THIS SECTION.

18 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -**
19 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following
20 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the
21 general assembly; except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant
22 to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an
23 item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item,
24 section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the
25 general election to be held in November 2026 and, in such case, will take
26 effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the
27 governor.

1 (2) This act applies to automatic renewal contracts offered or
2 renewed on or after the applicable effective date of this act.
